

Congratulations to five members who switched jobs this past season: Nadia Daniel, Arie de Jong, Nav Deol, Charlena Fong, and Bob Wang!

For Nadia, she leveraged Toastmasters' Level 4 Public Relations Strategies project to craft a "Hire Me!" speech that doubled as her elevator pitch—she aced the interview and smoothly transitioned from clinical trials in pediatric oncology to cardiovascular research.

For Bob, Toastmasters helped him build confidence for his interview. He answered some of his job interview questions much like Table Topics and used his Toastmasters experience in leadership and team-building as examples. Fortuitously, one of his interviewers is a fellow Toastmaster and his statements resonated with her.

Regularly practicing their public speaking and leadership skills through Toastmasters helped all of them during the job application and interview process. This is an excellent example of how participating in Toastmasters can benefit members in their personal and professional lives. Toastmasters provide a safe place for members to practice and improve their public speaking, form friendships, and have fun in the process!
